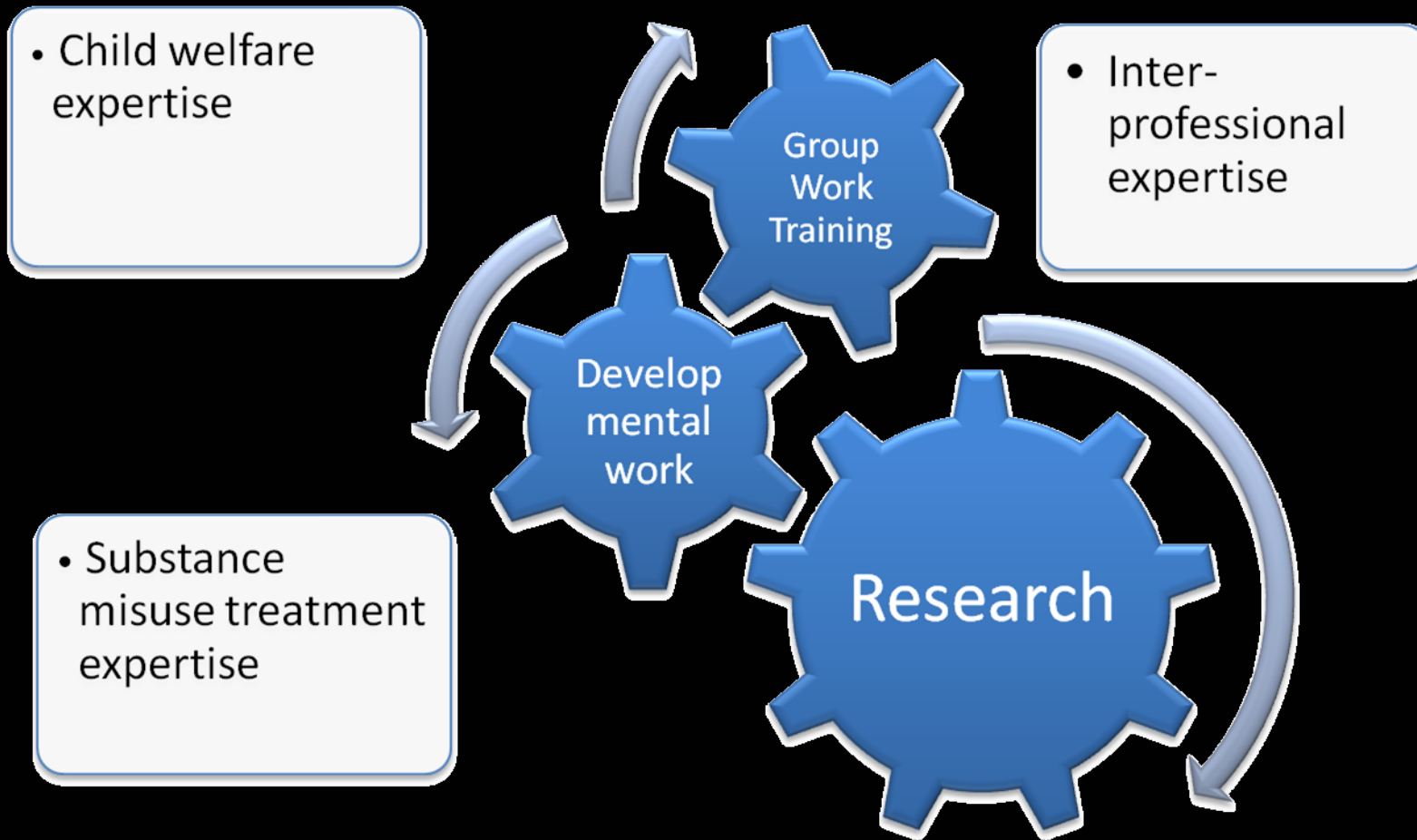
How to recognise substance misuse related problems in families at an early stage?

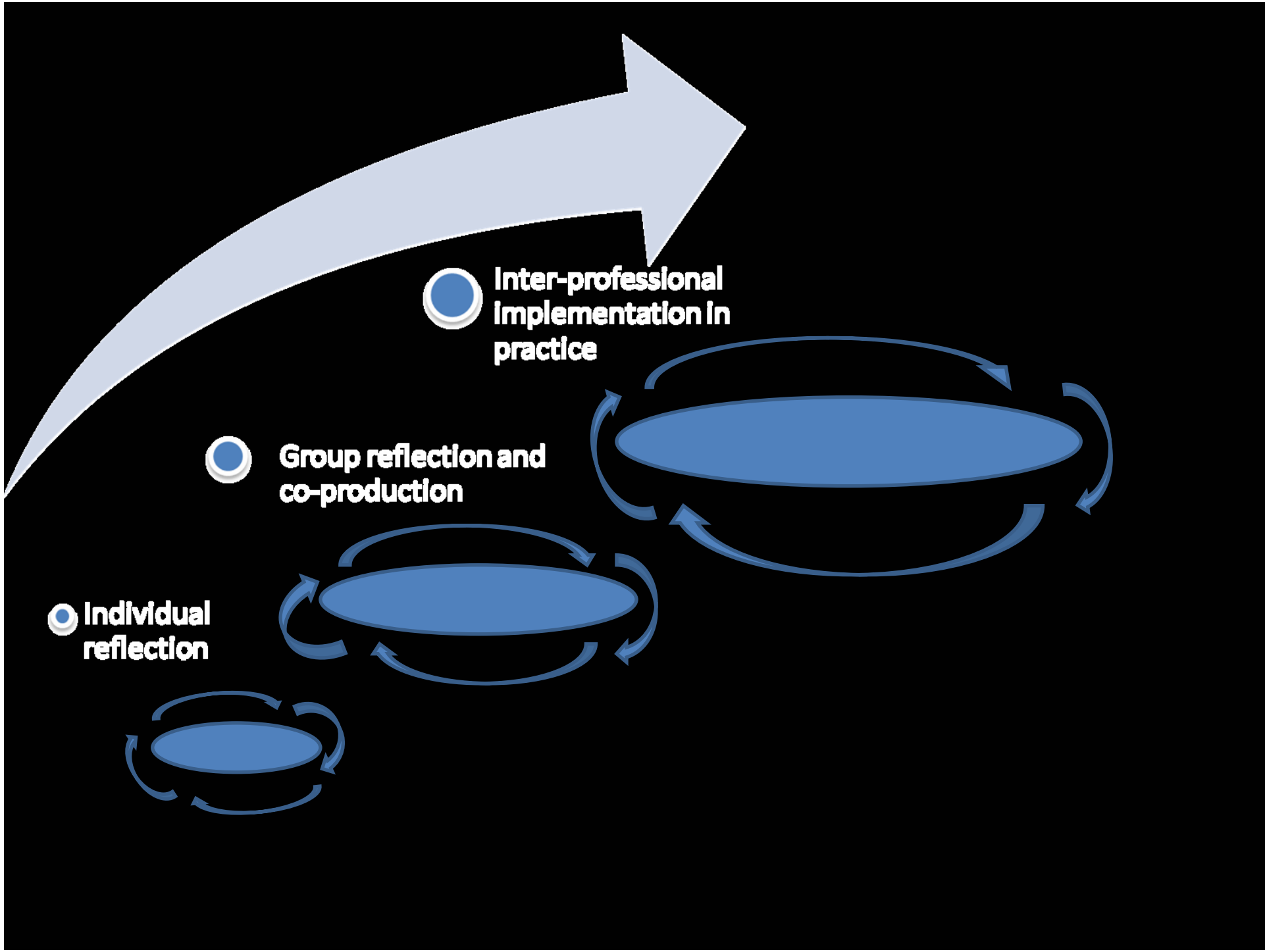

CO-OPERATIVE INQUIRY

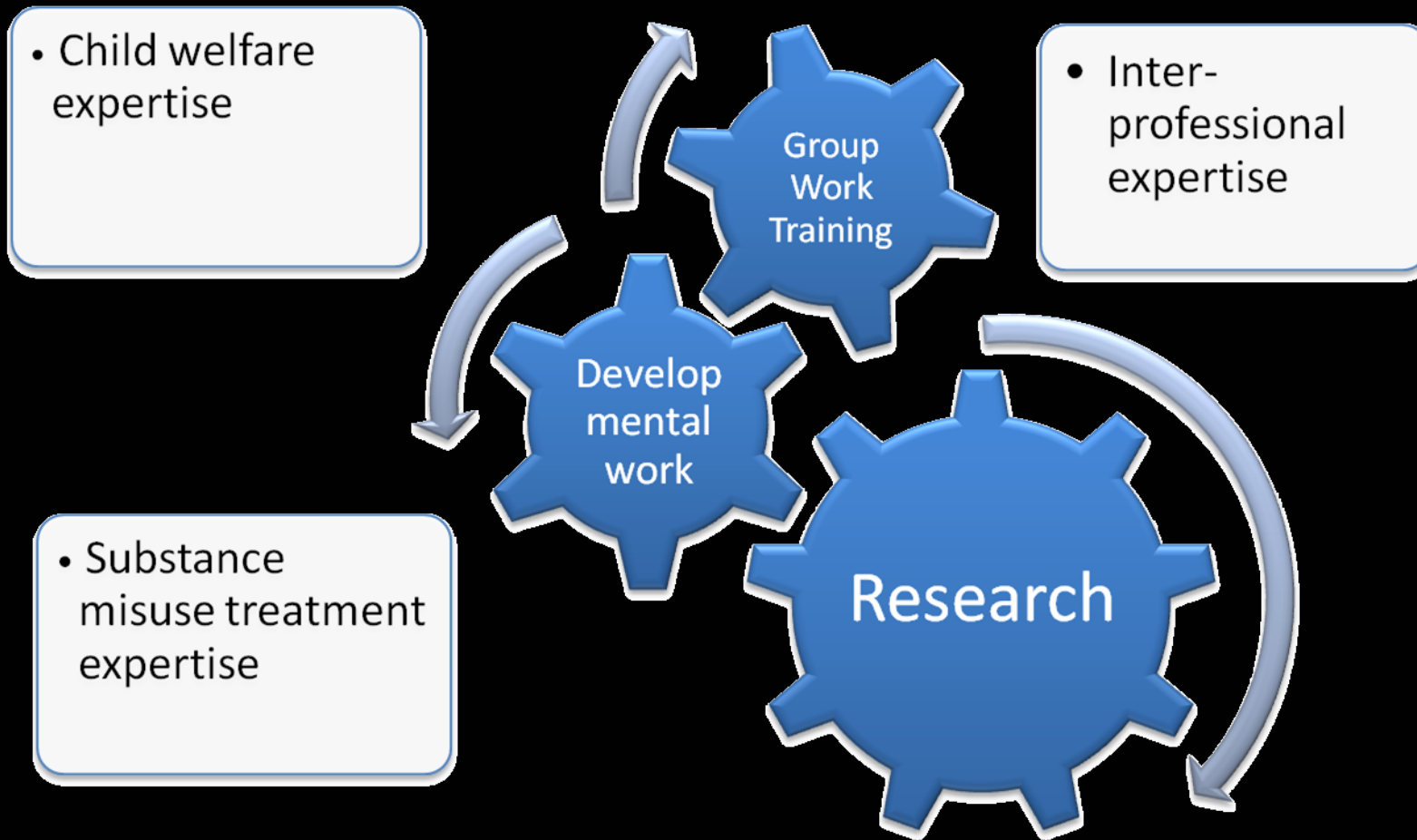
- Research *with* people not *on* people.

- Extended epistemology




Interprofessional Expertise?
